

Eight staff are commissioned and sent by First Presbyterian Church to Christ Covenant Church to begin CO Charlotte under the leadership of Neal & Jennifer Gooch. Ministry began at UNC Charlotte and UNC Greensboro.

Ministry begins at Wingate and Elon.

COC hosts its first Summer Beach Project, "Satisfied", in Myrtle Beach, SC with 90 students. First Cross Cultural Project to South Africa and ministry begins at Davidson College.

East Coast Network Director "I had just graduated from the University of Georgia on June 17, 1995 and my life had been radically impacted by the Person and work of Jesus Christ, and who He had become to me in just 3 short years. When I was presented with the opportunity to come on staff with Campus Outreach and forego being a Graphic Designer, the answer was really quickly a solid "Yes". I really had a strong desire to see students, like myself, who didn't know Jesus Christ have the opportunity to come to know Him personally and be saved from their sins into a new life with Him. Two months later after a lot of support calls, I found myself crossing the state line into North Carolina and my heart was full of faith and excitement. What might God do in the next 10 years....20 years....50 years through this one step of faith to join this small team of staff and start making disciples in North Carolina? Isa 54:2-4a was on my mind: "Enlarge the place of your tent, and let the curtains of your habitations be stretched out; do not hold back; lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes. For you will spread abroad to the right and to the left, and your offspring will possess the nations and will people the desolate cities. Fear not, for you will not be ashamed."

Pioneers have the privilege of seeing things first and laying the foundation for what would come next. In 1995, a small team was sent from CO Augusta to start CO Charlotte. This team was full of excitement, hope, and anticipation. When they stepped foot on campus, they had no idea what to expect. Their rallying cry was to dream big, start small, and go deep with a few. In those early years, God used this team to grow the ministry from two to five schools in North Carolina. This season culminated in the international expansion to Johannesburg, South Africa.

These distinct CO ministries began partnering on conferences, summer projects, staff trainings, and more.

#### Fruitful Campus Ministry to the Next Generation

We want to see each campus ministry evangelize, disciple, and develop fruitful laborers in the next generation. Through strategic staffing and effective evangelism that understands the culture, we hope to navigate critical issues like sexuality, gender, and technology. Our aim is to develop leaders in the context of campus mainstreams and help them set goals and make decisions in order to evangelize, disciple, and develop fruitful laborers in the next generation.



#### **Diversity in the Movements**

We desire to grow as a multiethnic and multicultural ministry. Our aim is to see diverse, multicultural leadership at every level of Campus Outreach. We pray that by engaging in diverse relationships on campus, partnering with our churches on race issues, and building a sustainable funding model, we would see this movement diversify and more fully reflect the kingdom.



#### **Developing Women in Ministry**

We want each woman in our ministry to find compelling places to serve and utilize their gifts and talents. By developing and equipping our female staff, providing women's development retreats, and understanding and utilizing our critical events, our prayer is that the women in our movement would develop as leaders and edify this ministry.



#### **International Partnerships**

Our aim is to maintain a strong partnership with our international CO franchises in such a way that both are mutually beneficial. We hope to do that through developing "global" disciples and deploying 2-year teams through the LEAD program. It is also important for us to continue to send Cross Cultural Projects to partner on the ground. We value our international partnerships and pray that through this aim we can love and serve them well.
